

# 1. Mid-Year Statistical Report (MYSR) Validation Rules

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MYSR has various validation rules that warn the user that he has made an error while entering the data. These validation rules do not prevent the user from saving the actual data but only serve as a reference tool to indicate something is not correct.

If any of the following rules is broken we display a corresponding message. There are two types of messages: error and warning. Error is when the values are not compliant to some logical demands, warning is when we require some additional information or the data is unexpected.

General list of rules and reference table to which the rule applies:

1. all numeric values must be positive integers - applies to all tables – error
2. all calculated numeric values must be positive integers – applies to all tables – error
3. all columns that are “of which UNHCR assisted” type have to have lower value than the corresponding “total” column value – error
4. all columns that are totals and have their corresponding “of which UNHCR assisted” should have the value for latter if totals are greater than 0 - warning

Full list of rules with detailed description:

1. Refugee table (Table A)
  - a. There shouldn't be more than one row with the same “origin” and “type of pop.” - error
2. Asylum seekers table – RSD table (Table B)
  - a. If “pending application January 1<sup>st</sup> 2015” or “pending application January 1<sup>st</sup> 2015 of which UNHCR assisted” is different from the corresponding values for ASR in the previous year – warning – request explanation in comment
3. Returnees (Table F)
  - a. There shouldn't be more than one row with the same “from (country of asylum)” and “type of population” - error
4. Stateless table (Table G)
  - a. There shouldn't be more than one row with the same “type” and “description” – error
5. Others of concern (Table H)
  - a. There shouldn't be more than one row with the same “description” and “country of origin” - error
6. Cross-table rules
  - a. If “increases between Jan 1<sup>st</sup> and June 30<sup>th</sup> spontaneous arrivals individual recogn.” (in table A) is not equal to sum of “decisions between Jan 1<sup>st</sup> and June 30<sup>th</sup> -> Recognized -> conv. Mandate” + “decisions between Jan 1<sup>st</sup> and June 30<sup>th</sup> -> Recognized -> Other” (in table B) – warning
